MAKE THESE SUMMERY HUES WORK FOR YOU:

- Blue and green should never be seen? No way! Take a tip from nature and mix sky blue with sea or leaf greens. Add an organic motif to bring an element of the outside in, like in the sheer curtains used here.
- A decorating palette should include a trio of hues – light, mid and dark shades.
- A splash of sunshine yellow, in this case flowers, brings vibrancy to the overall scheme.
- Brown and black details in the chairs and chandelier anchor the scheme. Without them, the decor would not hold together, despite the beautiful colours used.
- Group items with different shapes and similar tones, as on the table here. This is especially effective when there is a lot of white in a room, as it unifies the patches of colour for a more striking overall statement.
